Before His Honor Mr. Justice in Chambers

You and each of you are hereby strictly commanded under a penalty of \$500, to be levied on your lands, goods and chattels, and also of imprisonment, forthwith to return

and file in the office of the Provincial Secretary the following return as you are required to do by Act of Assembly of this Province, 62 Victoria, Chapter ten, intituled "An Act to amend the Act relating to Annual Returns of Municipal and Civic indebtedness, and to make further provision for returns of the assessed value of real and personal property in Counties, Cities and Towns."

CAP. XI.

An Act to Prevent the Profanation of the Lord's Day.

Sec.

1. Acts prohibited; exception; meaning of word "Person;" penalty against corporations; Acts permitted; proviso as to steamships under contract with Canadian Government.

2. Tippling, etc., prohibited.
3. Noisy games, gambling and racing prohibited.

4. Fishing, etc., not allowed.

forbidden ; penalties against

Passed 28th April, 1899.

Be it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Assembly as follows :

1.—(1) No person shall on the Lord's Day, commonly called Sunday, sell or publicly show forth, or expose, or offer for sale, or shall purchase any goods, chattels or other personal property, or any real estate whatsoever, or do or exercise any worldly labor, business or work of his ordinary calling (conveying travellers or Her Majesty's mail by land or by water, selling drugs and medicines and other works of necessity and charity only excepted.)

(2) The word "person" in this Act shall be construed as including corporations, except where the context requires a contrary interpretation; and any corporation which requires or permits its employees to carry on the business of such corporation, or to labor or work therefor, contrary to the provisions of this Act, shall for each offence forfeit a sum not exceeding \$100.

(3) Nothing herein contained shall prevent the delivery of milk or ice to customers on Sunday; or shall prevent telephone or telegraph companies from keeping open their offices for the purpose of receiving, transmitting and delivering messages; or the keepers of livery stables and cabs from letting on Sunday, horses and vehicles, with or without a driver, for purposes other than that of doing business or work; or the proprietors of daily morning newspapers or their employees from doing such kinds of work as may be necessary for the purpose of preparing and printing a Monday morning's edition of such newspaper; or any clergyman or physician from exercising the work of
