NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made by the Applicants hereinafter named to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, for a Grant of Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of the Act of the General Assembly of the said Province of New Brunswick, 56th Victoria, Chapter 7, intituled "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and Acts in amendment thereof, incorporating the said Applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "THE DAVID INGLIS COMPANY, (Limited)."

2. The objects for which the incorporation of the Company is sought are:

(a) To purchase or otherwise acquire, take over and hold the lumber business now carried on by David Inglis at Flat Lands, in the County of Restigouche and Province of New Brunswick, and elsewhere, and all or any of the real estate, lumber lands, timber lands, lumber permits, leasehold lands, leases, steam saw mills, mill machinery, tools, plant, piers, booms, booming privileges, water rights, franchises, and all other real and personal property, rights, privileges and assets of said David Inglis, or any part or parts thereof, or any interest or interests therein, and to assume all or any contracts, undertakings and liabilities of said

David Inglis in respect of said business, and to carry on, operate and continue said lumber business, with power to vary, extend and enlarge the same

(b) To carry on a general lumber business, including power to log, drive, saw, manufacture, ship, export, transport, buy, sell, trade and deal in all kinds and classes of logs, piling, railway sleepers or ties, timber and lumber, manufactured and unmanufactured, and the products of lumber, and to do all other things usually done in a general lumber business.

(c) To carry on a general store and supply business, and to buy, sell, trade and deal in all kinds and classes of goods, wares and merchandise incident thereto.

(d) To acquire by purchase, lease, charter, or otherwise, and to own, hold, operate, manage and control timber and lumber lands, and real estate, grants, licenses, permits, lumber privileges, water rights and franchises.

3. The Office or principal place of business of the Company is to be at Flat Lands, in the said County of Restigouche and Province of New Brunswick.

4. The amount of the Capital Stock of said Company is to be Five thousand one hundred dollars, divided into fifty-one shares of One hundred dollars each.
