NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under "The New
Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts,
Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Pro-
vince of New Brunswick, bearing date the twenty-third day of
August, A. D. 1899, incorporating Sanford L. Dakin, of Beaver
Harbour, in the County of Charlotte, in the Province of New
Brunswick, Trader; Lewis Connors, of the same place, Merchant;
John Doyle, of Saint George, in the County and Province afore-
said, Merchant; Elias W. Cross, of Beaver Harbour aforesaid,
Merchant; E. Milton Eldridge, of Beaver Harbor aforesaid, Mer-
chant; John F. Paul, of Beaver Harbor aforesaid, Merchant;
Patrick W. Connors, of Beaver Harbor aforesaid, Merchant;
Samuel McKay, of Pennfield, in the County and Province afore-
said, Custom Officer; George McCormick, of Saint George, in the
County and Province aforesaid, Truckman; and Scott E. Morrill,
of the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John
and Province aforesaid, Barrister-at-Law; for the following pur-
poses:—To carry on a general telephone business in all its branches,
including the building of offices, the setting, erection and con-
struction of posts, stringing or putting up of wires, making of
connections, buying and selling of telephone instruments, wire
and all telephone apparatus, and generally to do all and everything
necessary to make, complete, support, use, work and maintain a
system of telephone communication between the Village of Saint
George, in the County of Charlotte, and Black's Harbour, Penn-
field, and Pennfield Ridge in the Parish of Pennfield, in the County
of Charlotte aforesaid; and between the Village of Saint George
and Bonny River in the Parish of Saint George, in the said County
of Charlotte, and also between the said Village of Saint George
and Le'Tete Harbour, Mascarene, Back Bay and West Isles, in
the said County of Charlotte; and also between any and all other
points in the said County of Charlotte which the said Company
may deem it expedient or to its interest to so connect by telephone.

To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, own or hold such lands,
grants, licenses, rights, privileges, buildings, plant, and such other
real and personal property, and such leases, licenses, options,
franchises, rights and claims, of, in, to and upon the same, as may
be required or deemed necessary for the purposes of or incident
to the business aforesaid, and to do all other things necessary for
the accomplishment of the objects for which incorporation is
sought as aforesaid.

To erect and maintain the necessary posts, poles, wires and
other works along the public streets and highways between the
said places or in the said Territory, and for the purpose to have
full power and authority given to the said Company, their executors
or assigns, their agents, servants and workmen, to enter upon the
side or sides of all or any of the public roads, bridges, streets or
highways in the said County of Charlotte, and on the same to set
up, erect and construct such and so many posts, poles or other
works, as they in their discretion may deem necessary, for making,
completing, supporting, using, working and maintaining a system
of communication by telephone between the said places or in the
said Territory; to stretch wires thereon, and from time to time,
as often as is thought necessary to break open any part whatso-
ever of the said roads, streets or highways, not interfering with
that part of the same appropriated for the use of carriages, waggons
or horses, and to keep the same open during the time necessary
for the setting up, erecting and constructing of such posts, poles
or other works; subject, however, to certain conditions and terms
in the Letters Patent more particularly defined; by the name
of "THE PENNFIELD AND SAINT GEORGE TELEPHONE COMPANY,
(Limited)"; with a total Capital Stock of Two thousand dollars,
divided into two hundred shares of Ten dollars each.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That the Board of Education has
made the following Orders in regard to the use of certain text-books
in the Public Schools:

READERS.—The First Primer of a new series of Readers to be
known as "The New Brunswick Readers," is authorized for use at
the opening of the Schools in August, proximo. The Board has also
provided for the gradual introduction of the whole of said Series after
such intervals in the case of each grade as shall, so far as possible,
allow time for the books now in use to be exhausted.
