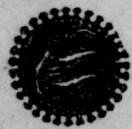

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NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made by the Applicants hereinafter named to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, for a Grant of Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of the Act of the General Assembly of the said Province 56th Victoria, Chapter 7, intituled "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and Acts in amendment thereof, incorporating the said Applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.
