

## NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of October, A. D. 1899, incorporating Roscoe R. Frohock, of the City of Malden, in the State of Massachusetts, in the United States of America, President of the Compressed Coal Company of New England; Carl E. Carlson, of Belmont, in the State of Massachusetts, in the United States of America, Builder; William F. Collins, of Millis, in the State of Massachusetts, in the United States of America, Retired Merchant; Sylvanus G. Morse, of the City of Boston, in the State of Massachusetts, in the United States of America, Real Estate and Insurance Agent; John Henry Harding, of the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John, in the Province of New Brunswick, Gentleman; Isaac W. Pinkham, of the City of Boston, in the State of Massachusetts, in the United States of America, Brick and Lime Dealer; and Richard K. Kilduff, of the City of Boston, in the State of Massachusetts, in the United States of America, Attorney-at-Law; for the following purposes, namely:—

To prospect and search for, explore, open, develop, work and maintain gold, silver, copper, coal and iron and lead mines, and mines of every other description, and to carry on the business of mining of every description, including crushing, washing, milling, smelting, reducing and otherwise treating the products of mines, and to acquire by purchase, hire, lease, or otherwise mine and work, manufacture and make merchantable gold, silver and other ores and deposits, and other minerals and metallic substances and compounds of all kinds, stone, oil, coal and earth and matters or things whatsoever, and to sell and dispose of the same, or any of the same.

To purchase and acquire certain mineral lands, leases, licenses and rights over minerals in the Province of Nova Scotia, and also to purchase and acquire lands in the Province of New Brunswick, or any other Province or District in the Dominion of Canada.

To purchase and otherwise acquire and deal in real and personal properties of all kinds, and in grants, concessions, leases, options, licenses or authorities of and over lands, mines ores, mineral rights, mineral properties, surveys and timber rights, buildings, factories, furnaces, plant and machinery, trade marks, easements and privileges, rights of way, water and other rights in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, and elsewhere in the Dominion of Canada, and any claims against any property or against any persons or Company, and deal either solely or jointly with others to pay for such property and things either in shares of the Company, or partly in share and partly in cash, or otherwise.

To construct, carry, out, maintain, improve, alter, manage, work, control and superintend any trails, roads, ways, tramways, bridges, walls, reservoirs, water courses, aqueducts, wharves, furnaces, saw-mills, crush works, hydraulic works, telegraphs, telephones, gas works, factories, machinery, warehouses, ships, vessels and other works and conveniences which may seem directly or indirectly conducive to, expedient and useful for any of the purposes of the Company, and to contribute to, subsidize or otherwise aid or take part in any such operation.

To use steam, water, electricity, or any other power as a motive power or otherwise.

To improve, manage, develop, lease, mortgage, sell, dispose of, or otherwise deal with all or any part of the property and rights of the Company, (including the granting of powers to work any mine or mines or claims or patents of the Company), upon any terms and with the power, subject to the provisions of Section 73 of the above mentioned Act, to accept as a consideration therefor any shares, stocks, debentures or securities of any other Company.

To acquire by purchase, lease, license, or otherwise, absolutely or conditionally, the rights of either generally or exclusively over any area or areas of or in all or any patent rights or processes or mechanical contrivances, useful or supposed to be useful, for any of the purposes of the Company, and to deal with and dispose of the same or any interest therein respectively.

To enter into any agreement or agreements for sharing profits, union of interest, or co-operation of any person or Company carrying on or about to carry on any business or transaction capable of being conducted so as to benefit the said Company.

To purchase and otherwise acquire and undertake all or any part of the business, property or liabilities of any person or Company carrying on any business which this Company is authorized to carry on, or possessed of property suitable for the purpose of this Company.

To pay out of the funds of the Company all expenses of or incidental to the formation, registration and advertising of the Company, and remunerate any person or Company for services rendered in placing of the shares in the Company's capital, or any debenture or other securities of the Company, or in or about the formation or promotion of the Company, or the conduct of its business; by the name of "THE BASIN OF MINAS GOLD COMPANY, (Limited)"; with a total Capital Stock of Two hundred thousand dollars, divided into two hundred thousand shares of One dollar each.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That an application will be made under the said Act, to the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for a Grant by Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, of a Charter constituting the applicants and others who may become shareholders in the Company proposed to

be created, a body corporate and politic, for the purposes and objects hereinafter mentioned.

The proposed corporate name of the Company is NEW BRUNSWICK MINING ASSOCIATION.

The objects for which its incorporation is sought are as follows:

To purchase, acquire and take over certain mining licenses and leases issued under the General Mining Act of the Province of New Brunswick, and covering and including certain mining lands and premises in the County of Gloucester and Province of New Brunswick.

To purchase, acquire and take over certain mining licenses and leases, covering and including certain mining lands and premises in Hants County and elsewhere in the Province of Nova Scotia.

To purchase, acquire, hold, use occupy and possess mines, minerals, mining leases and licenses, and mining and other rights, interests, options, grants, easements, authorities and privileges, lands, tenements and hereditaments and any interest or interests therein, and to carry on the business of mining, and the acquisition, development, work, purchase and sale of mining lands and premises, leases, licenses, rights and privileges in the Provinces of New Brunswick and Nova Scotia, and elsewhere in the Dominion of Canada, and generally to carry on the business of mining in the Province of Nova Scotia and elsewhere in the Dominion of Canada.

To acquire, purchase, use, hold, sell and dispose of any rights under letters patent, franchises and other rights and rights in lands, tenements and hereditaments in connection with the business of the proposed Company.

To acquire the good will of any business within the objects of the Company, and any lands, tenements and hereditaments, and the privileges, rights and powers appertaining to the same, and in connection with any such purchase or acquisition to assume the liabilities of any company, association, partnership or person.
