NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That the hereinafter named Applicants intend to petition and apply to the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, of the Province of New Brunswick, for the Grant of Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of said Province, pursuant to "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts, constituting said Applicants and others who may become shareholders in such Company thereby created, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the objects and purposes following, namely:—

(a) The proposed corporate name of such Company is "R. D. ROBINSON PUBLISHERS, (Limited)."

(b) The objects and purposes for which such incorporation is sought are:—Printing, publishing, circulating, selling and otherwise dealing in daily, tri-weekly, semi-weekly, weekly and monthly and semi-monthly newspapers, agricultural papers and magazines, and books and pamphlets, legal and commercial forms, and other papers and publications; also general job printing, bookbinding, stereotyping, engraving, lithographing and generally the starting and carrying on the business of newspaper proprietors, general printers and publishers and advertising agents and the buying, selling, importing and dealing, at wholesale and by retail, in books, paper, stationery, and printers' supplies and advertising novelties.

And also the purchasing or otherwise acquiring all or any part of the business, property, rights, franchises and liabilities of any company, society, partnership, or person formed for or engaged in any of the above or in any similar objects or purposes, and the conducting, amalgamating with, liquidating or winding up any such business, and the establishing, promoting, becoming stockholder, shareholder or partner in, or otherwise assisting or becoming interested in or connected with any company, society, partnership or undertaking in said Province, or elsewhere, the object or purpose of which shall in whole or part be the same as or similar to any object or purpose of this Company, or such as may be likely to promote or advance the interests of this Company.

And also the building, erecting, purchasing, hiring, importing or otherwise acquiring or providing all buildings, offices, workshops, plant, machinery, farm stock and implements, lands, tenements, hereditaments, and other things which such Company may desire or deem necessary, useful or expedient for or in connection with said objects or purposes, or any of them, and the selling, leasing, mortgaging, hypothecating or otherwise disposing of, borrowing or raising money upon all or any of the real and personal property, rights and franchises of the Company.

(c) The office or chief place of business of such Company is to be established at Sussex, in the Parish of Sussex and County of King's in said Province.

(d) The amount of the Capital Stock of such Company shall be Thirty thousand dollars, divided into three hundred shares of One hundred dollars each, of which at least Fifteen thousand dollars are actually subscribed.
