Canada, } vouchsafe to Our Dominion of Canada,
the blessings of a bountiful harvest and other blessings,

We, therefore, considering that these blessings enjoyed by
Our people throughout the said Dominion do call for a solemn
and public acknowledgment, have thought fit, by and with
the advice of Our Privy Council for Canada, to appoint, and
We do hereby appoint Thursday, the eighteenth day of
October next, as a day of General Thanksgiving to Almighty
God for the bountiful harvest and other blessings with which
Canada has been favoured this year; and We do invite all
Our loving subjects throughout Canada to observe the said
day as a day of General Thanksgiving.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF. We have caused these Our Letters
to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Canada to be
hereunto affixed. WITNESS, The Honourable HENRI
ELZEAR TASCHEREAU, Deputy of Our Right Trusty and
Right Well-beloved Cousin, the Right Honourable Sir
GILBERT JOHN ELLIOT, Earl of Minto and Viscount Mel-
gund of Melgund, County of Forfar, in the Peerage of the
United Kingdom, Baron Minto of Minto, County of Rox-
burgh, in the Peerage of Great Britain, Baronet of Nova
Scotia, Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Distinguished
Order of St. Michael and St. George, etc., etc., Governor
General of Canada.

TWENTY-FIRST day of SEPTEMBER, in the year of
Our Lord one thousand nine hundred, and in the sixty-
