## GOVERNMENT NOTICE.

### SEED WHEAT AND TURNIP SEED.

THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE will supply seed wheat, at cost, to Agricultural Societies, or others within the Province, if orders are sent to the Department at once.

The varieties supplied are: WHITE RUSSIAN, RED FYFE, WHITE FYFE.

Every precaution will be taken to procure clean seed.

One thousand pounds of the celebrated CARTER'S KANGEROO SWEDE TURNIP SEED have been imported from Messrs. James Carter & Co., London, and will be distributed in large or small quantities at 25 cents per pound. Small lots will be sent by mail. This seed has given universal satisfaction the last two years, being a heavy cropper and very solid flesh, producing in some cases twelve hundred bushels per acre.

Orders should be sent to the Department of Agriculture, Fredericton, as early as possible.

His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor has been pleased to approve and confirm the following Resolutions adopted by the Provincial Board of Health, on the 31st January, 1900:—

"It shall be the duty of such Local Board of Health to enforce the cleansing and disinfecting of any house or part thereof, with the articles therein, as may be deemed necessary to prevent or check any contagious or infectious disease, as provided for by Sub-section (B) of Rule 1 of the Regulations of the Provincial Board of Health, and in the event of the failure of such Local Board to perform such duties for a period of twenty-four hours after being notified through the Chairman of such Local Board by the Secretary of the Provincial Board, then and in such case, the Provincial Board are empowered to assume the same duties and powers and carry out such cleansing and disinfecting, with all the powers of the Local Board of Health in that behalf, at the cost of the Local Board, or of the owners of such houses, or of the Municipality, as the case may be, to the same extent as if carried out by the Local Board."

Said Rule to be LXVII. of Rules and Regulations.

RESOLVED, That Sub-section (A) of the Regulations of the Provincial Board of Health be repealed, and the following be enacted in lieu thereof:—

"The annual meeting shall be held at Fredericton during the first Session of the Legislative Assembly in each year, upon such a day as the Chairman of the Board shall appoint."
