

NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR LETTERS PATENT.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named, to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, for a Grant of Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and the Acts in amendment thereof and in addition thereto, incorporating the undermentioned applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

1. The proposed name of the Company is "THE A. A. McCLASKEY MANUFACTURING COMPANY, (Limited)."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:

(a) To purchase and acquire the business of manufacturing and of buying and selling, by wholesale and retail, cigars, tobaccos, smoking sundries, gums, and all kinds of confectionery heretofore carried on in the City of Saint John under the name of A. A. McClaskey & Son, and to buy and to acquire the plant, machinery, stock, stock-in-trade, book debts, assets and good-will of the said business.

(b) To carry on in the said City of Saint John, and elsewhere in the Province of New Brunswick, the trade and business of buying and selling, by wholesale and retail, cigars, tobaccos, smoking sundries, gums, biscuits, confectionery and other goods, commodities and merchandise, manufactured and unmanufactured, and of doing mercantile transactions generally.

(c) To manufacture all kinds of cigars, tobaccos, gums, confectionery, candies and biscuits, and to buy, sell, manufacture, trade or otherwise deal in any and every class of goods, commodities and merchandise necessary and incidental thereto.

(d) To purchase, lease, or otherwise acquire, hold and enjoy any lands and premises, or rights and privileges of and over lands, and to build, erect and maintain all manner of shops, stores, factories, warehouses, machinery and plant necessary for the purposes of the Company.

(e) To acquire, continue and carry on any mercantile or manufacturing business now being carried on by any person or persons, firm or corporation, or that hereafter may be carried on in the said Province.

(f) To lease, mortgage, pledge, hypothecate, alienate, sell and convey or otherwise deal with all and every part of the property, both real and personal, of the Company, upon any terms whatever, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, together with all such other powers, rights, privileges and franchises as are necessary or expedient for the carrying on of the business of the proposed Company or incident thereto.

3. The office and chief place of business of the Company is to be at the City of Saint John, in the Province of New Brunswick.

4. The amount of the Capital Stock of the Company is to be Seventy-five thousand dollars, divided into seven hundred and fifty shares of One hundred dollars each, of which shares four hundred, amounting in value to Forty thousand dollars, have been actually subscribed.
