NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named, to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, for a Grant of Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, under the provisions of the Act of the General Assembly 56 Victoria, Chapter 7, intitled "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may be shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purpose herein-after mentioned.
