

## NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the eighteenth day of October, A. D. 1900, incorporating William E. Earle, of the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John, in the Province of New Brunswick, Manager of "The Earle Publishing and Mercantile Company, (Limited);" Luella Dunn, of the same place, Bookkeeper; Stephen B. Bustin, of the same place, Barrister-at-Law; William S. Morrison, of the same place, Homœopathic Physician; and Hazen J. Dick, of the same place, Druggist; for the following purposes:—

To buy or otherwise acquire, take over and hold the business of the "Earle Publishing and Mercantile Company, Limited," a Company duly incorporated under the Laws of the Province of New Brunswick, as now carried on by the said Company, with all its book-debts and stock-in-trade in the said Province of New Brunswick and elsewhere, and all its rights, privileges, appurtenances and assets wheresoever situate and being; and generally to do all things necessary therefor and incident thereto; but the Company hereby incorporated shall be liable for all the debts and liabilities of the said "Earle Publishing and Mercantile Company, Limited."

To act as agent for, import, export, manufacture, publish, buy, deal in, lease, sell and dispose of, for cash, or on the instalment plan, bibles, albums, printed and blank books of every nature, kind and description.

To act as agent for, import, export, buy, acquire, take over, manufacture, hold, deal in, use, lease, sell and dispose of for cash, or on the instalment plan, clocks, watches, ornaments, furniture, wringers and household goods of every nature, kind and description.

To act as agent for, import, export, buy, acquire, take over, manufacture, hold, deal in, use, lease, sell and dispose of for cash, or on the instalment plan, all kinds of stock-in-trade, personal property, goods and chattels, patents, patent rights, and patented articles, wares and merchandize of every nature, kind and description that may by the said Company or its Directors be deemed necessary, expedient and advisable.

To buy, sell and dispose of chattel leases, instalment agreements, debts, evidences of debt and choses in action of every nature, kind and description; and generally to do all things necessary therefor and incident thereto.

To take securities from agents or persons in the employment of or dealing with the said Company, for the proper performing or carrying out of contracts made with the said Company, and generally to do all things necessary therefor and incident thereto.

To buy, acquire, take over, hold, deal in, sell and dispose of shares, stocks, debentures or securities of any other Company incorporated, for objects similar to those of the said Company, (subject to the provisions of the above mentioned Act), chattel leases, instalment agreements, debts, and evidences of debt, and choses in action of every nature, kind and description; and generally to do all things necessary therefor and incident thereto.

To buy or otherwise acquire and undertake and carry on all or any part of the business, good-will, property or liabilities of any person or persons, corporation or corporations carrying on any business which the said Company is authorized to carry on, or possessed of property suitable for the purposes of the said Company, when duly authorized so to do by a by-law confirmed at a general meeting of the said Company; and generally to do all things necessary therefor and incident thereto.

To enter into any agreement for sharing profits, union of interests, amalgamating or co-operating with any person or persons, company or companies, carrying on or about to be carrying on any business or transaction capable of being conducted so as to benefit the said Company, when duly authorized so to do by a by-law confirmed at a general meeting of the said Company; and generally to do all things necessary therefor and incident thereto.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named, to His Honor the Lieutenant Governor in Council for a Grant of Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of the Act of the General Assembly of the said Province, 56 Victoria, Chapter 7, intituled "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act," and the Acts in amendment thereof, incorporating said applicants and others who may hereafter become shareholders in such Company thereby created a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the objects and purposes hereinafter mentioned and set forth, namely:—

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "The Golden Grove Woollen Mills Company, Limited."

2. The objects and purposes for which such incorporation is sought are:

(a) To purchase, acquire, take over, hold and operate the Factory, Machinery and Manufacturing Business conducted at Golden Grove, in the Parish of Simonds, in the City and County of Saint John, in the Province of New Brunswick, by Alex. Willis & Sons, also procure and acquire the goodwill of said business, and all rights and privileges in connection with said business, and the stock, manufactured and unmanufactured, in connection with said business.

(b) To manufacture, produce, buy, sell, trade and deal in, at wholesale and retail, wool, yarns, cloths, clothing, blankets, and all goods manufactured from wool and cotton.

(c) To purchase, acquire, lease, build, sell, mortgage, convey and assign any and all lands, buildings, factories, shops and premises necessary or convenient for conducting, carrying on or benefitting the business of the proposed Company.

(d) To purchase, deal in and sell by wholesale and retail all kinds of goods, wares and merchandise necessary or convenient for the carrying on of a general manufacturing and mercantile business.

(e) To acquire the good will of any business within the scope of the Company, and any lands, tenements and hereditaments, mill sites, dams and water ways and privileges, and the rights and powers appertaining to the same.

(f) To mortgage or sell or disperse of the whole or any part of the property or rights of the proposed Company to any other company, corporation, person or persons.
