#### CAP. VI.

An Act to amend "The Woodmen's Lien Act, 1894." Passed 31st March, 1900.

BE it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative

Assembly, as follows:
Section 26 of "The Woodmen's Lien Act, 1894," is hereby amended, by inserting the words "and necessary witness fees according to the scale of fees in the County Court," after the words, "Cierk's fees," in line 2 of sub section (1), and also by inserting the words "and necessary witness fees" after the words "Clerk's fees" in line 1 of sub-section (2.)

#### CAP. VII.

An Act in further amendment of Chapter 28, of the Acts of Assembly 59th Victoria intituled "An Act to consolidate and amend the several Acts relating to Arrest, Imprisonment and Examination of Debtors.

Passed 31st March, 1900.

BE it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative

Assembly, as follows:
Section 36 of said Act 59 Victoria, Chapter 28, is hereby amended by inserting after the words "a judgment" and immediately before the words "in the Supreme Court," in the second line of said section, the words following "for the recovery by or the payment to him of money;" and by inserting between the words "or order for payment of money," in the thirteenth line, and the words "and when the judgment debtor is a corporation," in the fourteenth line

the words following: "And touching his estate and effects, and as to the property and means he had when the debt or liability was incurred which was the subject of the action or proceeding in which judgment has been obtained or order for payment as aforesaid was made, and as to the property and means he still has of discharging the said judgment, and as to the disposal he has made of any property since contracting such debt or incurring such liability and as to any and what debts are owing to him"; and by striking out the words "and therein to name a time and place," in the twenty second line of said section, and inserting in lieu thereof the words following, "ex parte upon affidavit showing the amount of such judgment and when and in what Court the same was recovered ment and when and in what Court the same was recovered, and either that the plaintiff has been unable to realize the judgment by execution, or that unsatisfied executions upon other judgments in favor of the applicant, or other person or persons, are then outstanding against the defendant, or, in case of an order for payment as aforesaid, showing that the money ordered to be paid has not been paid pursuant to said order, and the Judge or Clerk of the Peace in and by said order shall fix a time and place;" and by adding at the end of said Section 36 the words following:—"at the time and place in and by said order appointed for examination the debtor may, before being examined, show cause why the order for his examination should be rescinded, and upon sufficient cause shown the Judge or Clerk of the Peace shall received such order. If the order he not received the debtor rescind such order. If the order be not rescinded, the debtor may be examined forthwith, or the Judge or Clerk of the Peace may adjourn the examination and may at any time adjourn the further examination of the debtor to a time and place, to be by him specified in the order of adjournment."
