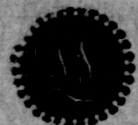

NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR LETTERS PATENT.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made
by the applicants hereinafter named, to His Honor the Lieutenant-
Governor in Council, for a Grant of Letters Patent under the Great
Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the pro-
visions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act,
1893," and amending Acts, and Acts in addition thereto, incor-
porating the applicants hereinafter named, and such other persons
as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company,

a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes
hereinafter mentioned.

1. The proposed name of the Company is "F. E. WILLIAMS
COMPANY, (Limited)"

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:

(a) To purchase and acquire the wholesale and retail grocery,
provision, fish and victualling business, and the business of pork
packing and pork manufacturing heretofore carried on in the City
of Saint John under the name of Frank E. Williams, and to buy
and acquire the stock in trade, merchandise, plant, machinery,
fixtures, book debts, assets and good-will of said business.

(b) To carry on the business of buying and selling, by wholesale
and retail, groceries, provisions, dairy produce, meats, fish, vege-
tables, fruits and all kinds of goods, commodities and merchandise,
and to carry on a general trading, mercantile, commission, broker-
age, import and export business.

(c) To carry on the business of buying, selling, manufacturing,
packing and curing of pork, beef, meats, fish, vegetables and fruits.

(d) To purchase, lease, or otherwise acquire, hold and enjoy
lands, buildings, stores, factories, warehouses, machinery and
plant considered necessary, desirable or expedient by the Com-
pany for the purposes of the Company.

(e) To lease, mortgage, pledge, hypothecate, alienate, sell, con-
vey or otherwise dispose of or deal with all and every part of the
property, both real and personal, of the Company, upon any terms
whatever, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, together with
all such other powers, rights, privileges and franchises as are
necessary or expedient for the carrying on of the business of the
proposed Company or incident thereto.

3. The office and chief place of business of the Company is to be
at the City of Saint John, in the Province of New Brunswick.

4. The amount of the capital stock of the proposed Company is
