

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named, to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, for a Grant of Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and the Acts in amendment thereof and in addition thereto, incorporating the undermentioned applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

1. The proposed name of the Company is "THE KITCHEN MERCANTILE COMPANY, (Limited)." 2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:

(a) To take over, continue and carry on the crockery-ware, furniture and variety business, heretofore carried on in the City of Fredericton, New Brunswick, under the name of "Willard Kitchen and Co." and to buy and acquire the stock, stock in trade, book debts, assets and good-will of the said business, and also to purchase and acquire the freehold and leasehold lands and premises and the buildings thereon, now used in connection with the said business of the said Willard Kitchen & Co.

(b) To carry on in the said City of Fredericton, and elsewhere in the Province of New Brunswick, a wholesale and retail crockery-ware, furniture, wood and wooden-ware, variety, novelty, dry goods, grocery, boot and shoe, hardware, paints and oils, glass machinery, agricultural and farming implements, bicycle, wheeled vehicle, furnishing, clothing, millinery, and general trading and mercantile business, (the general powers of the Company in respect of the class of business to be engaged in, not to be in any way limited or curtailed by the enumeration of the special purposes and objects hereinbefore set out), and to erect power, plant and buildings and ins all machinery for the manufacture of, and carry on in any part of the Province the manufacture of any of the goods, articles or things hereinbefore mentioned, and to acquire in any part of the Province sufficient real estate and buildings for the purposes of the said mercantile and manufacturing business, or any part of the same.

(c) To acquire, continue and carry on any mercantile or manufacturing business now being carried on by any person or persons, firm or corporation, or that may hereafter be carried on in the said Province.

(d) To lease, mortgage, pledge, hypothecate, alienate, sell and convey, or otherwise deal with all and every part of the property, both real and personal, of the Company, upon any terms whatever, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, together with all such other powers, rights, privileges and franchises as are necessary or expedient for the carrying on of the business of the proposed Company, or incident thereto.

3. The office and chief place of business of the Company is to be at the City of Fredericton, in the County of York and Province of New Brunswick.

4. The amount of the Capital Stock of the Company is to be Seventy-five thousand dollars, divided into seven hundred and fifty shares of One hundred dollars each, of which shares five hundred, amounting in value to Fifty thousand dollars, have been actually subscribed.

5. The applicants will ask leave to have inserted in the Letters Patent of Incorporation, a provision that the stock in the said Company shall not be assigned or assignable to any person or persons, firm or corporation whomsoever or whatsoever, except by and with the consent of two-thirds in value of the stockholders of the said Company, or by act of or devolution by law, and that this provision shall not be subject to repeal or alteration by by-law of the Company.
