## PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, unhappily, an epidemic of smallpox has broken out in the Province of Quebec, and through intercommunication by rail and otherwise some cases have recently arisen in this Province, namely at Campbellton and Moncton; AND WHEREAS, if the disease were allowed to spread the most disastrous consequences to life might ensue, and the business and other interests of the Province would seriously suffer;

HIS HONOR would therefore impress upon the Provincial Board of Health, the Local Boards and all citizens, the urgent necessity of taking immediate and precautionary measures to prevent the spreading of the contagion, and would call upon all good citizens throughout the Province to aid in every way the efforts of the authorities in stamping out the disease.
