

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

To prospect and search for, explore, open, develop, work and maintain gold, silver, copper, coal and iron mines, and mines of every description in the Yukon District, Province of British Columbia and any other Province, Territory or District in the Dominion of Canada, and to carry on the business of mining of every description including crushing, washing, smelting, reducing, and otherwise treating the products of mines, and to acquire by purchase or otherwise mine and work manufacture and make merchantable gold, silver and other ores and deposits, and other minerals and metallic substances and compounds of all kinds, stone, oil, coal, earth or matters or things whatsoever, and to sell and dispose of the same or any of the same.

To purchase and acquire certain mineral lands, leases, licenses and rights over minerals in the Yukon District, the Province of British Columbia, and any other Province, Territory or District in the Dominion of Canada, and also to purchase and acquire lands and properties in the Yukon District British Columbia and any other Province, Territory or District in the Dominion of Canada.

To purchase and otherwise acquire and deal in real and personal property of all kinds, in grants, concessions, leases, options, licenses or authorities of and over lands, mines, ores, mineral rights, mineral properties, surveys and timber rights, buildings, factories, furnaces, plant and machinery, trade marks, easements and privileges, rights of way, water, and other rights in the Yukon District, the Province of British Columbia and any other Province, Territory or District in the Dominion of Canada, and any claims against any property, or against any persons and Companies, and either solely or jointly with others to pay for any such properties and things either in shares of the Company or partly in cash and partly in shares or otherwise.

To construct, carry out, maintain, improve, alter, manage, work, control and superintend any trails, roads, ways, tramways, bridges, walls, reservoirs, water courses, aqueducts, wharves, furnaces, saw mills, crush works, hydraulic works, telegraphs, telephones, gas works, factories, machinery, ware houses, ships, vessels, and other works and conveniences (excepting Railways) which may seem directly or indirectly conducive to, or expedient and useful for any of the purposes of the Company, and to contribute to, subsidize or otherwise aid or take part in any such operations.

To use steam, water, electricity or any other power, as a motive power or otherwise.

To improve, manage, develop, lease, mortgage, sell, dispose of, or otherwise deal with all or any part of the property and rights of the Company, (including the granting of powers to work any mines or claims or patents of the Company), upon any terms and with power, subject to the provisions of Section 73 of the above mentioned Act, to accept as a consideration therefor any shares, stocks, debentures or securities of any other Companies.

To acquire by purchase, lease, license or otherwise absolutely or conditionally, the rights either generally or exclusively over any area or areas of or in, all or any patent rights or processes or mechanical or other contrivances useful, or supposed to be useful for any of the purposes of the Company, and to deal with and dispose of the same or any interest therein respectively.

To purchase, deal in, and sell by wholesale or retail all kinds of goods, wares and merchandise necessary for carrying on of a general mercantile business.

To enter into any agreement for sharing profits union of interests, or co operation with any person or Company, carrying on or about to carry on any business or transaction capable of being conducted so as to benefit the said Company.

To purchase or otherwise acquire and undertake all or any part of the business, property and liabilities of any person or Company carrying on any business which this Company is authorized to carry on, or possessed of property suitable for the purposes of this Company.
