## NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the fifteenth day of February, A. D. 1900, incorporating Alexander McElwee, of the City of New York, in the State of New York, in the United States of America, Broker; Lewis A. May, of the same place, Broker; James R. McDonald, of the same place, Contractor; Henry G. Catlin, of the same place, Mining Engineer; Mathew Lodge, of the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland, in the Province of New Brunswick, Accountant; and William B. Chandler, of the same place, Barrister; for the following purposes:—
