IN THE SUPREME COURT IN EQUITY.

Mary Loudoun, Plaintiff; and
Alexander Loudoun and John Loudoun, Defendants.

WHEREAS it has been made to appear, by affidavit, to the satisfaction of me, the undersigned, one of the Judges of the Supreme Court, that the above named defendants, Alexander Loudoun and John Loudoun, do not reside within the Province so that they cannot be served with a Summons, and that their place of residence cannot be ascertained by the plaintiff, and that the above plaintiff has a good prima facie grounds for filing a Bill against the above named defendants: I do hereby order, that the said defendants, Alexander Loudoun and John Loudoun, on or before the first day of JULY next, do enter an appearance in this suit (if they intend to defend the same), wherein a Bill will be filed against them the above named defendants by the above named plaintiff, for the partition of certain lands and premises described as follows:— "All that piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being in the Town of Chatham aforesaid, bounded on the Easterly side by King Street, so called; on the Northerly side by Wellington Street, so called; on the Westerly side by lands now owned and occupied by Wilfred R. Gould; and on the Southerly side by lands owned by the late J. R.
