

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named, to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor in Council for a Grant of Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of the "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts, incorporating the applicants hereinafter named and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purpose hereinafter mentioned.

1. The proposed name of the Company is "THE PURE MILK AND DAIRY COMPANY, Limited."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:

(a) To establish at the City of Saint John a milk and dairy depot with such plant, machinery and facilities as may be necessary and expedient for the purifying and pasteurizing of milk for the purposes of conducting and carrying on the milk and dairy business.

(b) To acquire and purchase any milk and dairy business at present or heretofore carried on at the City of Saint John in the name of one individual or by a Company and to buy and acquire the stock in trade, merchandise, plant, machinery, fixtures, book debts, assets and good will of said business.

(c) To carry on the business of buying and selling by wholesale and retail milk and dairy produce of all kinds, provisions and merchandise incidental to their said business.

(d) To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, hold and enjoy lands, buildings, stores, factories, cold storage warehouses, machinery and plant considered necessary, desirable or expedient by the Company for the purposes of the Company.

(e) To lease, mortgage, pledge, hypothecate, alienate, sell, convey or otherwise dispose of or deal with all and every part of the property, both real and personal, of the Company upon any terms whatever, subject to the provisions of said Act; together with all such other powers, rights, privileges and franchises as are necessary or expedient for the carrying on of the business of the proposed Company or incident thereto.

3. The office and chief place of business of the Company is to be in the Parish of Rothesay, in the County of Kings, in the Province of New Brunswick.

4. The amount of the Capital Stock of the Company shall be Fifteen thousand dollars, to be divided into three thousand shares of Five dollars each.
