PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the Chairman and Secretary of "The Wardens
of the Sussex Fire Ward," has made a return to the Honorable
the Provincial Secretary, setting forth that a meeting of the
ratepayers of the Parish of Sussex, in the County of King's, liable
to pay rates and taxes in the said Parish of Sussex, either in
respect of property within said Fire Ward, or of residence there-
in, was held at Sussex aforesaid, on the fourteenth and sixteenth
days of May last, to determine whether the said ratepayers should
approve of and desire the issue and sale of Twenty-five thousand
dollars of Debentures, as mentioned and authorized by the first
section of an Act passed on the third day of April, A. D. 1901,
intituled "An Act to further amend the Act 49th Victoria, Chap-
ter 47, intituled 'An Act to provide increased fire protection for
the Village of Sussex,'" for the purposes set forth in said Act.

That at such Election there were 194 votes cast, that one hun-
dred and forty-three voted "Yes," and fifty-one voted "No," and
that thereupon such question was decided in the affirmative by a
majority vote of the ratepayers present and voting at such
meeting.

I do therefore, under and by virtue of the provisions of the said
Act, proclaim and declare that the said Fire Wardens may make,
issue and sell such Debentures as aforesaid, for the purposes in
said Act mentioned.
