

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named, to His Honor, the Lieutenant Governor in Council, for a Grant of Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and the Acts in amendment thereof and in addition thereto, incorporating the under-mentioned applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "The Fredericton and Woodstock Steamboat Company (Limited)"

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:—

(c) To mortgage, hypothecate or otherwise dispose of all or any of the Company's interests or possessions.

(d) To hold, acquire, purchase, or obtain and hold by any lawful means, any and all lands, tenements and hereditaments necessary for the business of the Company.

3. And that a shareholder is not individually liable, but the liability is based upon the number of his shares upon which the assessments have been made, and when the stock has been fully paid up, each shareholder's liability to the creditors of the Company ceases, but each shareholder is liable for the amount of his stock, to the amount of the unlevied assessment or balance unpaid on the same.

4. The office or chief place of business of the Company is to be at or near Brown's Hotel, in the Parish of Southampton, in the County of York.
