PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it hath pleased Almighty God to call to His Mercy our Late Sovereign Lady, Queen Victoria, of Blessed and Glorious Memory, by whose Decease the Imperial Crown of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and all other of Her Late Majesty's Dominions is solely and rightfully come to the High and Mighty Prince Albert Edward, Prince of Wales;

I, the said Abner R. McClelan, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of New Brunswick, assisted by my Executive Council, and with their hearty and zealous concurrence, do therefore hereby Publish and Proclaim that the High and Mighty Prince Albert Edward, Prince of Wales, is now, by the Death of our Late Sovereign of Happy and Glorious Memory, become our only lawful and rightful Liege Lord, EDWARD THE SEVENTH, By the Grace of God, King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Defender of the Faith, to whom are due all Faith and constant Obedience with all Hearty and Humble Affection;

And I do Hereby Require and Command all Persons whomsoever to yield Obedience and Govern themselves accordingly, Beseeching God, by whom Kings do reign, to Bless the Royal Prince Edward the Seventh with Long and Happy Years to reign over us.

Given at Fredericton this Twenty-fifth day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand and nine hundred and one.

GOD SAVE THE KING.



A PROCLAMATION, requiring all persons being in office or authority at the decease of the Late Queen to proceed in the execution of their respective offices.

WHEREAS, under and by virtue of the provisions of the several Statutes in such case made and provided, no office, place or employment within the Province is vacated or become void by reason of the Demise of the Crown;

I, THEREFORE, with the advice of my Council, declare His Majesty's Royal Will and Pleasure to be, and I do hereby Direct and Command that all and every person and persons who at the time of the Demise of Her Late Majesty Queen Victoria of Glorious Memory duly and lawfully held or were duly and lawfully possessed of, or invested in any Office, Place or Employment within this Province, appointed by or holding office under the Executive Government of the Province, do severally according to their places, offices or charges proceed in the performance and execution of all duties belonging to their respective Offices whilst they shall hold the same respectively during His Majesty's Pleasure;

AND I DO ORDER, that all Incumbents of such offices shall as soon hereafter as possible take the usual and customary Oath of Allegiance to His Majesty, King Edward the Seventh, before the proper officer or officers thereunto appointed;

AND I do hereby Require and Command all His Majesty's Subjects to be aiding, helping and assisting at the commandment of the said Officers and Ministers in the performance and execution of their respective Offices and Places.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the twenty-fifth day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and one, and in the First Year of His Majesty's Reign.
