**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN,** That application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named, to His Honor, the Lieutenant Governor in Council, for a Grant of Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and the Acts in amendment thereof and in addition thereto, incorporating the under-mentioned applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.
