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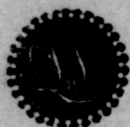

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the fourth day of September, A. D. 1901, incorporating Henry Chestnut, Merchant and Manufacturer; George O'Neill, Manufacturer; Jesse W. Tabor, Manufacturer; William T. Chestnut, Merchant; and Harry G. Chestnut, Merchant; all of the City of Fredericton, in the County of York and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:—

To purchase and acquire the factories, plants, machinery, lands and premises, whether freeholds or leaseholds, or both, with the buildings and improvements thereon, now owned by Henry Chestnut; doing business heretofore under the firm name and style of "J. C. Risteen & Company," in the City of Fredericton, in the County of York and Province of New Brunswick, and by Jesse W. Tabor and George O'Neill doing business heretofore in the firm name and style of "Tabor & O'Neill," in the City of Fredericton, in the County of York and Province aforesaid, and the woodworking and manufacturing business heretofore carried on by the said Henry Chestnut under the name, style and firm of "J. C. Risteen & Company" as aforesaid, and Jesse W. Tabor and George O'Neill, throughout the Province of New Brunswick and Dominion of Canada, and also all the patents, patent rights, licenses, franchises, personal property, choses in action, rights and effects belonging to the said Henry Chestnut as aforesaid, and Jesse W. Tabor and George O'Neill as aforesaid, and the goodwill of both of the said businesses.

To carry on the manufacture and sale of lumber, building materials, wood, wood products, building and all other things in connection therewith and incidental thereto, and to establish and maintain branch factories or warehouses in any part of the Province of New Brunswick or elsewhere.

To purchase and acquire the stock in trade, real and personal property, franchises, patents, patent rights, licenses, effects or assets of any person or persons or incorporated Company now or hereafter carrying on any similar manufacturing or mercantile business, or to take security thereon, and to continue same when so acquired, and to sell and dispose of same when so acquired and every part thereof.

To purchase, acquire, lease, have and hold real and personal property of all kinds, and to sell and dispose of and convey such property, real and personal, or any part thereof.

To acquire by purchase, lease, license, or otherwise, absolutely or conditionally, any patent, patent rights, process or mechanical contrivance, useful or supposed to be useful, for the purposes of the proposed Company, and to deal with and dispose of the same or any interest therein.

To enter into any agreement or agreements, union of interest or co-operation with any person or persons, Company or Companies carrying on or about to carry on any business or transaction deemed capable of being conducted for the benefit of the proposed Company.

To sell and convey, alienate, lease, mortgage, pledge or otherwise dispose of or deal with all and every part of the property, both real and personal, of the said Company, upon any terms whatsoever, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, together with all such powers, rights, privileges and franchises as are necessary or expedient for the carrying on of the business of the said proposed Company in all its branches, with such other things as are incident thereto; by the name of "J. C. RISTEEN COMPANY, (Limited)"; with a total Capital Stock of Forty-eight thousand dollars, divided into four hundred and eighty shares of One hundred dollars each.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, for a Grant of Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of the Act of Assembly of the said Province, 56th Victoria, Chapter 7, intitled "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and Acts in amendment thereof, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

1. The proposed name of the Company is "THE JAMES BARNES CONSTRUCTION COMPANY, Limited."

2. The objects for which the incorporation of the Company is sought are:

(a) To survey, lay out, construct and equip lines of railway to be operated by steam, electrical or other power, and from any point or points to any point or points within the Province of New Brunswick or within the Dominion of Canada.

(b) To carry on a general contracting, constructing, trading, engineering and mechanical business within the Province of New Brunswick or within the Dominion of Canada.

(c) To purchase, sell and deal in railway and engineering supplies and equipment, including engines, cars and other rolling stock.

(d) To construct railway bridges, road-beds, buildings, stations, station grounds, workshops, yards, wharves, terminal facilities and other appurtenances requisite or incidental to the construction and working of lines of railway.

(e) To construct telegraph lines from any point or points to any point or points within the Province of New Brunswick or within the Dominion of Canada, and supply all necessary machinery and apparatus for the construction and working of the same.

(f) To purchase, acquire, sell and deal in railway shares, stocks, bonds and securities, and to enter into contracts for the construction and equipment of lines of railway and lines of telegraph and taking payment therefor in whole or in part in the stocks, bonds and securities of said lines of railway and lines of telegraph, and also in money and land grants and subsidies or other bonuses or franchises granted to said railway or telegraph lines, so far as the same may by law be used or applied for defraying the cost of construction or erection of the same.

3. The office or principal place of business of the said Company is to be at Fredericton, in the County of York, in the said Province.

4. The amount of the proposed Capital Stock to be Forty thousand dollars, divided into four hundred shares of One hundred dollars each.
