been favoured this year; and We do invite all Our loving subjects
throughout Canada to observe the said day as a day of General
Thanksgiving.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, We have caused these Our Letters to
be made Patent and the Great Seal of Canada to be hereunto
affixed. WITNES, Our Right Trusty and Right Well-beloved
Cousin the Right Honourable Sir GILBERT JOHN ELLIOT, Earl
of Minto and Viscount Melgund of Melgund, County of For-
far, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom, Baron Minto of
Minto, County of Roxburgh, in the Peerage of Great Britain,
Baronet of Nova Scotia, Knight Grand Cross of Our Most
Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, etc., etc.,
Governor General of Canada.
