PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the sixteenth day of September, A. To build, purchase, lease, or otherwise own, hold and possess in fee simple, or otherwise, lands, grants, licenses and lumber lands, lumber rights, options, mills, mill privileges, milling business, stores, warehouses, machine shops, boiler shops, blacksmith shops, water ways and rights, buildings, plant and machinery, marine slips, vessels, tugs, scows, barges, wharves, booms, dams, driving rights, franchises and privileges, and such other real and personal property as may from time to time be acquired or deemed necessary for all or any of the purposes of or incident to the business aforesaid, or any part of it, with power from time to time to encumber the same, or any part thereof, and from time to time to dispose of any property, real or personal, at pleasure, and to do any and all other things considered necessary for the accomplishment of the objects for which incorporation is sought as aforesaid; by the name of "THE EDWARD SINCLAIR LUMBER COMPANY, (Limited)"; with a total Capital Stock of Forty-two thousand dollars, divided into four hundred and twenty shares of One hundred dollars each.
