To lease, mortgage, pledge, hypothecate, alienate, sell, convey or otherwise dispose of or deal with all and every part of the property, both real and personal, of the Company upon any terms whatever, subject to the provisions of said Act; together with all such other powers, rights, privileges and franchises as are necessary or expedient for the carrying on of the business of the proposed Company or incident thereto; by the name of "Pure Milk and Dairy Company, (Limited)"; with a total Capital Stock of Fifteen thousand dollars, divided into three theusand shares of Five dollars each. of Five dollars each.
