## In the Supreme Court in Equity.

Atkins, William Atkins, Margaret Sutherland, and Jane Weaver, Defendants.

WHEREAS it has been made to appear, by affidavit, to the satisfaction of me, the undersigned, one of the Judges of the Supreme Court, that certain of the above named defendants, that is to say the defendants William Atkins and William Sutherland do not reside within the Province of New Brunswick, so that they cannot be served with a summons, and that the places of residence of the said defendants cannot be ascertained by the plaintiff, and that the above plaintiff has good prima facie grounds for filing a bill against the above named defendants:

I DO HEREBY ORDER, that the said defendants, William Atkins and William Sutherland, on or before the first day of September, A. D. 1901, do enter an appearance in this suit, if they intend to defend the same, wherein a Bill will be filed against the above named defendants and others by the above named plaintiff, for the partition of certain lands and premises in the Parish of Blissfield, in the County of Northumberland and Province of New Brunswick, bounded and described as follows:—

"All that certain tract of land situate, lying and being in the Parish of Blissfield, in the County of Northumberland, on the southerly side of the Southwest Branch of the Miramichi River, and bounded on the lower or easterly side by lands of John McGraw, on the upper or westerly side by ungranted Crown lands, on the northerly side or front by the said branch of the Miramichi River, and on the rear or southerly side by ungranted Crown lands."

The defendant William Sutherland is a son of George Sutherland, deceased, who died intestate, the said George Sutherland being a son and heir of the said Thomas Sutherland, deceased.
