### NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the thirteenth day of June, A. D. 1901, incorporating John Palmer, of the City of Fredericton, in the County of York and Province of New Brunswick, Manufacturer; John Kilburn, of the same place, Lumberman; Charles K. Palmer, of the same place, Salesman; Sarah C. Palmer, of the same place, wife of the said John Palmer; and Matilda Kilburn, of the same place, wife of the said John Kilburn; for the following purposes:—

To purchase and acquire the Tanneries and Larrigan Factory, with their respective plant and machinery, lands and premises, whether freeholds or leaseholds, or both, with the buildings and improvements thereon, now owned by John Palmer, in the City of Fredericton, in the County of York and Province of New Brunswick, and the Larrigan and Shoepack manufacturing business heretofore carried on by the said John Palmer throughout the Dominion of Canada, and also all trade marks, patents, patent rights, licenses, franchises, personal property, choses in action, rights and effects belonging to the said John Palmer, and the good will of the said business.

To carry on the business of manufacturing and selling leathers, larrigans, shoepacks and other footwear of all kinds, and all things in connection therewith and incidental thereto, and to establish and maintain factories or warehouses in any part of Canada or elsewhere.
