NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under and in accordance with the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and the Acts in amendment thereof and in addition thereto, the persons hereinafter named intend to apply to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor in Council of the Province of New Brunswick, for a Charter by Letters Patent under the Great Seal, constituting the applicants and such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

The proposed corporate name of the Company is "THE BUG DEATH CHEMICAL COMPANY, (Limited)."
