#### CAP. XXXI.

An Act in further amendment of "The New Brunswick Elections Act of 1889."

1. Sec. 21 amended by striking out paragraph (a) and substituting another by which voter must reside in Electoral district in which he votes; City and County of Saint John excepted.

Passed 3rd April, 1901. Br it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative

Assembly, as follows:—

1. Section 21 of "The New Brunswick Elections Act of 1889," is hereby amended by striking out paragraph (a) and substituting therefor the following:—

(a) Who shall in his own right hold real estate to the value of the bundled deliant of paragraph and permitted the state of the same bundled deliant of paragraph and permitted the same bundled deliant of paragraphs. (a) Who shall in his own right hold real estate to the value of one hundred dollars, or personal property, or real and personal property together, to the value of four hundred dollars in any electoral district, to the value of four hundred dollars tered in the Voters' List for such electoral district, and is at the time of tendering his vote the owner of the real estate or personal property, or real and personal property together as aforesaid in such district, and who is at the time of tendering his vote a resident of and domiciled within such electoral district; provided, however, that in the case of the electoral districts of the City and County of Saint John, a person who, under the law as it stood prior to the passing of this Act, would have been entitled to vote in respect of real estate in City, or in the case of a person being a resident of the County and who would have been entitled to vote on real estate in the City, shall still be entitled to vote, notwithstanding the the City, shall still be entitled to vote, notwithstanding the

aforegoing provisions.

2. Whereas there has been no revision of the voters' list of 2. Whereas there has been no revision of the voters' list of the Town of Grand Falls during the past year, and it is essential that a list should be established. Therefore it is enacted that the portion of the lists prepared by the revisors of the Parishes of Grand Falls and Drummond, containing the names of electors resident within the limits of the Town of Grand Falls, shall be the voting list for said Town of Grand Falls for election to the General Assembly until a proper list of the said Town shall be prepared by the Revisors of said Town. Number Six —For all that part of the Parish of Drummond lying southerly of a line beginning at the southwest angle of Lot number 127, granted to Sergeant Edward Gregory in the Ranger Settlement, thence easterly along the southerly line of said lot to its southeast angle, thence northerly along the eastern line of said lot to the northwest angle of Lot number 37 granted to Henry Howlett in Range 2, Tilley Settlement north, thence easterly along the northern line of said lot to its northeastern angle, thence southerly along the eastern line of last mentioned lot to the northwestern angle of Lot number 22 in Range 3, and thence easterly along the northern line of 22 in Range 3, and thence easterly along the northern line of said Lot number 22 and its eastern prolongation to the Gordon parish line—at or near Edward Currie's, near the mouth of Little River;
