Thanksgiving.

affixed. WITNES, Our Right Trusty and Right Well-beloved
Cousin the Right Honourable Sir GILBERT JOHN ELLIOT, Earl

far, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom. Baron Minto of
of Minto, County of Roxburgh, in the Peerage of Great Britain
Baronet of Nova Scotia, Knight Grand Cross of Our Most
Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, etc., etc.,
Governor General of Canada.
