NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, for a grant of Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of the Act of the General Assembly, 56th Victoria, Chapter 7, intituled "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and the Acts in amendment thereof, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the said proposed Company, a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

1. The name of the Company is to be "SAINT JOHN ABATTOIR COMPANY, (Limited)."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:

(a) To erect, maintain and operate in the City and County of Saint John, and at such other places as may be by the Company deemed desirable, an abattoir or abattoirs, freezing houses, cold storage plants, warehouses and other buildings necessary or expedient for the purposes of the businesses of the Company.

(b) To carry on the business of buyers, sellers and handlers of and dealers in cattle, hogs and poultry, and of all kinds of meat, fish and game, and the businesses of pork packing and meat preserving in all branches of such respective trades and businesses, both wholesale and retail.

(c) To carry on the trades or businesses of abattoir operators, fellmongering, tanning, warehousing, cold storage, cold storage warehousing, dealers in hides, fat, tallow, grease and other animal products, and the manufacturing of all by-products thereof.

(d) To purchase, take on lease or in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire any real and personal property, and any rights, franchises, easements or privileges which the Company may think necessary or convenient for the purposes of its business, and to purchase, take on lease, hire, construct, or otherwise acquire, maintain and operate any buildings, machinery, works, tramways and other conveyances by land and water and any other plant necessary or convenient for the purposes of the Company, with power to let, sell, mortgage, pledge, hypothecate or otherwise dispose of the real and personal property or other possessions of the Company, or any part or parts thereof.

(e) To manufacture, purchase or otherwise acquire, own, hold, mortgage, sell, assign and transfer, invest, trade and deal in any

goods, wares and merchandise and property of every class and description used or dealt in or useful in connection with any of the trades or businesses aforesaid.

(f) To carry on any other business, whether manufacturing or otherwise, which may seem to the Company capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with the above or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of or render profitable any of the Company's property or rights.

(g) To do all and everything necessary, suitable, convenient or proper for the accomplishment of any of the purposes or the attainment of any one or more of the objects herein enumerated, or incidental to the powers herein named, or which shall at any time appear conducive or expedient for the protection or benefit of the corporation, either as holders of or as interested in any property or otherwise.

(h) To do any and all of the things above set forth as objects, purposes, powers, or otherwise, and all things incidental thereto, to the same extent and as fully as natural persons might or could do as principals, agents, contractors, trustees, or otherwise.

3. The office or principal place of business is to be in the City and County of Saint John, in the Province of New Brunswick.

4. The amount of the Capital Stock of the Company is to be One hundred thousand dollars, divided into one thousand shares of One hundred dollars each.
