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NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made
by the applicants hereinafter named, to His Honor the Lieutenant-
Governor in Council for a Grant of Letters Patent, under the
Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the
provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act,
1893," and the Acts in amendment thereof and in addition thereto,
incorporating the undermentioned applicants and such other
persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed
Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for
the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "SHEPODY
NAVIGATION COMPANY, (Limited)."

2. The objects for which incorporation are sought are:

(a) To build, buy, acquire, own, sell, lease, hire, charter, control,
sail and navigate one or more British steamboat or boats and
other vessels.

(b) To carry and convey passengers, goods, wares and mer-
chandise, and to do the work of common carriers by steamers or
other conveyances, and to provide, furnish and sell food, refresh-

ment and entertainment, on water or land, in connection with
their business as passenger carriers; and to build, buy, acquire,
lease, own and sell wharves, piers and warehouses and other struc-
tures to be used in connection with steamboating and forwarding
business.

(c) To carry on the business of towage in all its branches, and
to supply, furnish and sell fresh water to all steamers and other
vessels.

(d) To mortgage, hypothecate or otherwise dispose of all or any
of the Company's interests or possessions.

(e) To hold, acquire, purchase or obtain and hold by any lawful
means any and all lands, tenements and hereditaments necessary
for the business of the Company, and to do all such things as are
incident to the purposes aforesaid.

3. A Shareholder is not individually liable, but the liability
is based upon the number of his shares upon which the assess-
ments have been made, and when the stock has been fully paid
up, each shareholder's liability to the creditors of the Company
ceases, but each shareholder is liable for the amount of his stock
to the amount of the unlevied assessment or balance unpaid on
the same.

4. The office or chief place of business of the Company is to be
at the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland, New
Brunswick.

5. The amount of the Capital Stock of the Company is Twenty-
