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NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named, to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor in Council for a Grant of Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the Provisions of "The New Brunswick, according to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and the Acts in amendment thereof and in addition thereto, incorporating the undermentioned applicants and such other incorporating the undermentioned applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the propose Company, a body cerporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.
