

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That the persons hereinafter mentioned will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, for the Grant of a Charter of Incorporation, by Letters Patent, under the Great Seal, according to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and Acts in amendment thereof and in addition thereto, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for all the purposes hereinafter set forth.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "THE MAJESTIC STEAMSHIP COMPANY."
