

# IN THE MATTER OF "THE NEW BRUNSWICK JOINT STOCK COMPANIES' ACT, 1893."

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made by the parties hereinafter named, to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor in Council for the granting of Letters Patent, under the Great Seal, according to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "NORTH END WOODWORKING COMPANY, (Limited)."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:

(a) To buy or otherwise acquire, take over and hold the land and premises and improvements thereon, engine, boiler, machinery, manufactured lumber, etc., owned, occupied and used heretofore by Alfred O. Mabee in connection with the Woodworking business heretofore carried on by him in the City of Saint John, in the Province of New Brunswick, under the name, style and firm of the "A. A. Mabee Company."

(b) To purchase, hold and sell, mortgage or otherwise dispose of lumber lands and other lands in fee, or otherwise, and also timber and timber limits by lease, license, or otherwise, and such grants, concessions, options of and over lands, timber rights and surveys as may be requisite or necessary for the purpose of or incident to the business of the Company, and generally to purchase and otherwise acquire, hold, mortgage or dispose of real and personal property.

(c) To buy, acquire, take over, hold, deal in, keep, sell, manufacture, or have manufactured, all kinds of metals and woods and their products, and building material of every nature, kind and description, bricks, stone, sand, mortar, roofing, milling supplies, and all articles and things of practical utility in the conduct of the Company's business.

(d) To engage in the manufacture and sale of furniture, builder's supplies, and everything in connection with a Woodworking and Manufacturing business, and such things as are incidental thereto.

(e) To buy, sell, hold and deal in all kinds of lumber and woods, manufactured and unmanufactured, paints and varnishes, and to take and enter into contracts for the erection, painting or repairing of buildings, and to do painting and jobbing of every nature, kind and description.

(f) To use, develop, manufacture or produce steam, water, electricity or any other power, force or energy capable of being developed into mechanical power as a motive power or otherwise.

(g) To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, hold and enjoy all the property, franchises, rights and privileges held and enjoyed by any other individual or Company carrying on business similar in whole or in part to that which this Company is authorized to carry on.

(h) To pay for such properties, rights, franchises or things as are above set out, either in shares of the Company, or partly in shares, or otherwise, with full power to lease, sub-let, dispose of, or otherwise deal with all or any part of the property and rights of the Company.

(i) To carry on any other business, whether manufacturing or otherwise, which may seem to the Company capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with the aforesaid business, or any of them, or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of the Company's property or rights.

3. The office or chief place of business of the Company is to be at the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John.

4. The capital stock of the Company is to be Twenty thousand dollars, (\$20,000.00), divided into two hundred shares of Two hundred dollars each, of which fifty shares are actually subscribed.
