The following portion of Cap. 33 is published for general
information:—

CAP. XXXIII.

An Act to further amend The Public Health Act.

Passed 10th April, 1902.

Whereas owing to the recent Small Pox Epidemics in
various sections of the Province, and the danger of their re-
currence, it is desirable to provide for the compulsory vac-
cination of children attending the Public Schools, and it is
desirable to further amend the Public Health Act as herein-
after provided;

Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor and
Legislative Assembly as follows:—

1. Before entering any child upon the Register of any
Public School, or admitting such child to such Public School,
there shall be produced by such child, or by its parent, or
guardian, or some person acting in behalf of such child, a
certificate, to the satisfaction of the teacher of such school, or
in case there are more teachers than one of any such school,
to the satisfaction of the principal thereof, that such child
has been successfully vaccinated within three years from the

time of such request for registry or admission; or if such child
has been vaccinated within the said period of three years and
the vaccination has not been successful, there shall be pro-
duced to such teacher or Principal satisfactory evidence that
by reason of such child having been previously successfully
vaccinated, such recent vaccination has not been successful,
or that such child is immune.

His Honour The Lieutenant-Governor in Council directs the
publication of the following for general information:—

His Majesty's Charge d'Affaires at Rome has sent to the Foreign
Office the Law regulating entry, without payment of the ordinary
fee, to the national museums, galleries, excavations and monu-
ments of Italy, which has been approved by the Royal Decree of
the 13th April, 1902.

The privilege of free entry is by the Law accorded to foreigners
who are—

(a) Artists.

(b) Art students and art critics who have issued noteworthy
publications.

(c) Professors of Archaeology, History, Literature, and Art.

(d) Pupils of archaeological, historical and art institutions;
students in the departments of literature and philosophy, and in
schools of practical engineering.

Applications for a general permit for free entry to all museums,
&c, must be sent to the Ministry of Public Instruction on stamp-
ed paper of 1 lira. 20c, with an unmounted photograph (of the
applicant) not to exceed 5 centim. by 8 in size.

Applications for free entry to archaeological and artistic insti-
tutes in a single town must be sent on stamped paper of 60 cen-
times to one of the heads of the institutes; and if the permit is re-
quired for more than a month, a photograph must be sent of the
size mentioned in the preceding paragraph.

The applications must be accompanied by the following docu-
ments:—

For persons under (a) and (c), by an academical document *visé*
by the Italian Diplomatic Representative or Consul in the country
to which the applicant belongs, or by the Diplomatic Repre-
sentative of that country in Italy.

For persons under (b), by one of the publications which they
have published.

For persons under (d), by an official document showing that
they stand on the books of the institutions, mentioned under
that heading, for the year in which they apply. The document
must be *visé* as in the case of the documents furnished by persons
under (a) and (c).

As His Majesty's Diplomatic Representative at Rome is not
always in a position to authenticate without previous inquiry
documents issued by institutions in the United Kingdom, art
students, etc., are recommended to have such documents coun-
tersigned by the Italian Consular officers in this country before
leaving.
