### ASSEMBLY CHAMBER,

FREDERICTON, THURSDAY, 10th April, 1902.

THIS day, at 12 o'clock, noon, His Honor the Honorable JABEZ BUNTING SNOWBALL, Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of New Brunswick, came to the Assembly Chamber, and being seated on the Throne, after assenting to the several Bills passed during the Session, was pleased to close the Session with the following

### SPEECH:

*Mr. Speaker, and Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,*

"I thank you for the close attention which you have given to the general business of the Session, as well as to those special subjects which I have from time to time submitted for your consideration.

"Several of the measures which you have dealt with are of great importance and they will, I trust, materially enhance the prosperity of the people of the Province.
