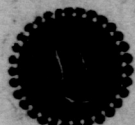

NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR LETTERS PATENT.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made by the parties hereinafter named to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, for a grant of Letters Patent under the Great Seal and in accordance with the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

1. The proposed name of the Company is to be "J. A. PATTERSON LUMBER COMPANY, (Limited)."

2. The objects for which the incorporation of the Company is sought are:

(a) To carry on a general lumbering, saw mill and woodworking manufacturing business in all branches including the logging, driving, sawing, manufacturing and shipping of lumber of every nature, kind and description, and the buying, selling, and otherwise dealing in the same, manufactured and unmanufactured, and to operate sawmills for the sawing and manufacture of lumber.

(b) To carry on a general store and mercantile business, and to buy, sell, trade and deal in all kinds and classes of goods, wares and merchandise incident thereto.

(c) To purchase, lease and otherwise acquire, own and hold such lands, grants, licenses, lumber lands, permits, lumber rights, mills, mill privileges, milling business, water rights, buildings, plants, machinery, vessels, tugs, scows, and such other real and personal property, and such leases, licenses, options, franchises, rights and claims of, in and upon the same as may be required or be deemed necessary, for the purpose of or incident to the said business, and to do all other things necessary for the accomplishment of the objects for which incorporation is sought as aforesaid.

3 The office or principal place of business of the Company is to be at Salmon River Falls, Drummond, Victoria County, in the Province of New Brunswick.

4. The amount of the capital stock of the said Company shall be Twenty thousand dollars, divided into four thousand shares of Five dollars each.
