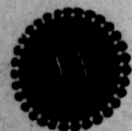

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the seventeenth day of July, A. D. 1902, incorporating Samuel Winter, of the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick, Merchant; William Christie, of the same place, Baker; James McD. Cooke, of the same place, Druggist; Gurney R. Jones, of Lewisville, in the Parish of Moncton, in the County and Province aforesaid, Lumber Dealer; Andrew H. Jones, of the said City of Moncton, Banker; E. Albert Reilly, of the said City of Moncton, Barrister-at-Law; and James P. Geddes, of the City of New York, in the State of New York, in the United States of America, Banker; for the following purposes, namely:—

To acquire, own and operate mining leases and mining property in the Province of New Brunswick, and to purchase, acquire and take over certain mining licenses, leases, mineral claims and mineral property issued, and to be issued, under the General Mining Act of the Province of British Columbia, and covering and including certain mining lands and premises in the Cariboo District, in the Province of British Columbia.

To purchase, acquire, take over, hold, use, occupy and possess mines, minerals, mining property, mica, mining licenses and leases, mineral claims, claims and mining and other rights, interests, options, grants, easements, authorities and privileges, lands, tenements and hereditaments, and any interest or interests therein, and to carry on the business of mining, and the acquisition, development, work, purchase and sale of mica and other

mining lands and premises and mining leases, licenses, rights and privileges and mining property in the Province of British Columbia, in the District of Cariboo, and generally to carry on the business of mining in the Province of British Columbia and elsewhere in the Dominion of Canada.

To mine, work, produce, prepare for use and sale, manufacture, sell, dispose of and deal in mica and all products of mica, and in anything produced therefrom by any process of manufacture, reduction, or otherwise, and generally to deal in any products resulting from the manufacture or working of mica ores.

To construct, purchase, alter and maintain, and to contribute to the purchase, construction, alteration or maintenance of buildings, tramways, wire rope tramways, canals, wharves, bridges, piers, roads, or other works calculated to afford any facility in carrying on or extending the business of the Company, and to operate such tramways, wire rope tramways, canals and other works by steam, electricity, water power or other motive power.

To purchase, hire, construct or manufacture for use, in connection with the business of the Company, any ships, barges, steamboats, rolling stock, machinery or plant.

To acquire, purchase, use, hold, sell, transfer and dispose of any rights under Letters Patent, franchises, trade-marks and other rights, and rights in lands, tenements and hereditaments in connection with the business of the proposed Company.

To acquire the good-will of any business within the objects of the Company, and any lands, tenements and hereditaments, privileges, contracts, rights and powers appertaining to the same, and in connection with any such purpose or acquisition to assume the liabilities of any company, association, partnership, or person.

To sell and dispose of the whole or any part of the property or undertaking of the proposed Company to any other Company or person.

To acquire by original subscription, or otherwise, and to purchase, hold, sell, transfer or otherwise dispose of the shares, stock, debentures, bonds and other obligations of any other Company carrying on or authorized to carry on any business or undertaking within the powers of the proposed Company.

To construct, purchase and maintain any plant, buildings, works, factories, mills and other undertakings for the purposes of the Company, or connected therewith or necessary or expedient for any of the purposes of the Company or incidental thereto.

To purchase, acquire, hold, use, sell, transfer and dispose of personal property of all kinds, machinery, patents and trade-marks, timber and lumber rights, mica, ores, metals, minerals and mining rights, property and easements of every description, and all rights of way and common carriage in connection with the business of the Company, and to lease, mortgage, sell, transfer and dispose of and otherwise deal with all or any of the property, real or personal, powers, privileges and franchises of the Company, and to accept as a consideration therefor any shares, stock, debentures or securities of any other Company, and generally to do all things necessary for carrying out the objects of the said Company hereinbefore mentioned, or any of them, or anything incidental thereto, subject, however, to the Laws of the Province of New Brunswick; by the name of "BRITISH COLUMBIA MICA COMPANY, (Limited)"; with a total Capital Stock of One million dollars, divided into ten thousand shares of One hundred dollars each.
