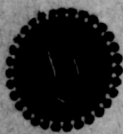

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of March, A. D. 1902, incorporating Benjamin F. Pearson, of the City of Halifax, in the Province of Nova Scotia, Barrister-at-Law; James Friel, of Dorchester, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick, Barrister-at-Law; Steadman Crandall, of the City of Moncton, in said County of Westmorland, Postmaster; George F. Pearson, of the City of Halifax aforesaid, Barrister-at-Law; and Frederick W. Emmerson, of Sackville, in the said County of Westmorland, Judge of Probate for the said County; for the following purposes, namely:—

To bore for oil and gas, and to refine and manufacture, and buy and sell the same, and generally to carry on the business of oil and gas; to purchase and acquire, hold, use and occupy any lands, buildings, mines, minerals, mining and other rights, interest, options, concessions, grants, easements, authorities and privileges, and any interest therein; to acquire any exclusive rights in letters patent, franchises or patent rights or privileges, or in lands in connection with the business of the Company; to acquire the good-will of any business within the objects of the Company, and any lands, privileges, rights and contracts appertaining to the same, and in connection with any such purchase to undertake the liabilities of any company, association, partnership or person; to sell or otherwise dispose of the whole or any branch or part of the business or property of the Company to any Company carrying on or formed for the purpose of carrying on any objects similar to those of this Company; to acquire by original subscription, or otherwise, and to hold, sell, mortgage or otherwise dispose of shares, stocks, whether common or preferred, debentures, debenture stocks, bonds and other obligations of any Company carrying on or formed for the purpose of carrying on any trade or business within the objects of this Company; to apply maintain, open, work, control and superintend any plant, buildings, dwellings, stores, depots, supply houses, warehouses, from time to time any part of the funds, stock, whether common or preferred, bonds, debentures and other obligations of the Company for any purpose of the Company; to construct, manufacture,
