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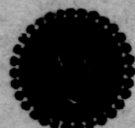

IN THE MATTER OF "THE NEW BRUNSWICK JOINT STOCK COMPANIES' ACT, 1893."

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made
by the parties hereinafter named, to His Honor the Lieutenant-
Governor in Council, for the granting of Letters Patent under the
Great Seal, according to the provisions of The New Brunswick
Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893, and amending Acts.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "THE
WOODSTOCK LUMBER AND MANUFACTURING COMPANY, Limited."

2. The objects for which the incorporation of the Company is
sought are:

A. To purchase or otherwise acquire, take over, hold and own
a block of 1000 acres of lumber land situate in the Parish of
Northampton, in the said County of Carleton, and being the
Western part of what was formerly known as the Fraser Block
and described in a Deed thereof from Lewis P. Fisher to J. Nor-
man W. Winslow, dated the twenty-sixth day of February, A. D.
1896. And also the real estate conveyed by George Elihu Shea
and Harriet S. his wife to said J. Norman W. Winslow, by Deed
dated the twenty-sixth day of August, A. D. 1893, situate at Graf-
ton in the said Parish of Northampton, and known as the Grafton
Steam Mill, and all mills, mill buildings, machines, machinery
and tools, piers, mill privileges, water-rights and franchises
thereto belonging or in anywise appertaining, and also the real
estate conveyed to said J. Norman W. Winslow by W. Duppa N.
Smith and F. Maria Smith his wife, by Deed dated the twenty-
fifth day of September, A. D. 1900, situate on River Street in the
Town of Woodstock, in said County of Carleton, and the business
now owned and carried on thereon by said J. Norman W. Wins-
low, trading under the name of The Woodstock Manufacturing

Company, including the said last mentioned Real Estate and the
buildings, plant, machinery, rights, credits and good-will and
assets generally of the said business, and to carry on said business
at Woodstock or elsewhere in the said Province of New Brunswick.

B. To purchase, hold and sell, mortgage or otherwise dispose of
Lumber lands and other lands in fee or otherwise, and also timber
and timber limits by lease, license, or otherwise, and to manu-
facture, purchase and sell saw logs, timber and lumber, and to
carry on the business of lumbering in all its branches, and other
business incident thereto or connected therewith, and to manu-
facture furniture, doors, sashes, blinds and any other article of
which wood shall form a component part.

C. To purchase, lease, mortgage or otherwise acquire, hold and
sell, build and operate grist mills, flour mills, saw mills, wood-
working and furniture factories, and to carry on all business
incident thereto or usually connected therewith, with power to
purchase and sell and deal in grain and flour and bread stuffs
generally.

D. To carry on a general store and mercantile business, and to
buy, sell, trade and deal in all kinds and classes of goods, wares
and merchandise incident thereto.

E. To carry on a general business as Contractors and Builders.

F. To purchase, lease, or otherwise acquire, hold and enjoy all
the property, franchises, rights and privileges held and enjoyed
by any other individual or company carrying on business similar
in whole or in part to that which this Company is authorized to
carry on.

G. To pay for such properties, rights, franchises or things as
are above set out either in shares of the Company, or partly in
cash or partly in shares, or otherwise, with full power to sell
lease, sub-let, dispose of, or otherwise deal with all or any part of
the property and rights of the Company.

H. To carry on any other business, whether manufacturing or
otherwise, which may seem to the Company capable of being con-
veniently carried on in connection with the aforesaid business,
or any of them, or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the
value of the Company's property or rights.

3. The office or principal place of business of the Company is to
be at Woodstock, in the County of Carleton and Province of New
Brunswick.

4. The amount of the Capital Stock of the Company shall be
Twenty-four thousand dollars, divided into two hundred and
forty shares of One hundred dollars each.
