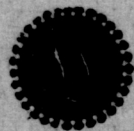

### NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under "the New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of April, A. D. 1902, incorporating Joseph W. Dumas, of Grand Anse, in the Parish of New Bandon, in the County of Gloucester and Province of New Brunswick, General Merchant, Sylvestre Theriault, of the same place, Postmaster; Peter Landry, of the same place, Farmer; Isidore Godin, of Saint Joseph, in the Parish and County aforesaid, Manager; and John Colton, of Saint Joseph, aforesaid, in the County aforesaid, Engineer; for the following purposes, namely:

To buy and otherwise acquire, take over and hold the business of Joseph W. Dumas, as now carried on by the said Joseph W. Dumas in the County of Gloucester, under the name and style of Joseph W. Dumas, with any and all of his real estate, lands and premises, leases, book debts, stock-in-trade, personal property, effects, debts, stock-in-trade, manufactured and unmanufactured, machinery, tools, supplies, plant and fixtures, and the good-will of the said business in the said Province of New Brunswick and elsewhere, and all his rights, privileges and appurtenances in connection with said business and assets wheresoever situate and being, and to continue said business and generally to do all things necessary therefor and incident thereto.

To buy or otherwise acquire all the gear, machinery, engines, boilers, implements, tools, belts, saws and all or any other requirements in connection with one or more saw mills, and to manufacture, purchase, import, export, hold, deal in, keep, lease, sell and otherwise dispose of lumber of all kinds and description, whether manufactured or unmanufactured.

To erect, build, maintain, keep, repair, enlarge or diminish in size, construct any building or buildings in which may be placed saw mills, roller mills, carding mills, and in which milling operations of all kinds are to be carried on, and to operate the same.

To buy, purchase or otherwise acquire all gear, machinery, rollers, implements, tools and any and all or any other requirements in connection with one or more grist mills, to operate the same and to manufacture flour, bran, short feed, meal and all productions of wheat, oats, barley, starch, corn and any other cereals, and to import, export, buy, sell or otherwise deal in wheat, flour, bran, short feed, starch, meal and all other cereals and the products thereof.

To buy, purchase or otherwise acquire wool, and to import, export, sell or otherwise deal in wool and the products thereof, either manufactured or unmanufactured.

To purchase, buy, build, erect, maintain, keep, use, construct, and repair one or more buildings to be used as starch factories and to operate the same, and to buy, sell, acquire, import, export, or otherwise deal with potatoes, starch and all products thereof, whether manufactured or unmanufactured.

To act as agent for, buy, acquire, import, export, hold, deal in, keep, lease, sell, dispose of and manufacture all such stock in trade, goods and chattels, wares and merchandize of every nature, kind and description as may by the said Company, or its Directors be deemed necessary, expedient and advisable, and also to buy and sell debts and evidences of debt, and choses in action of every nature, kind and description, and generally to do all things necessary therefor or incident thereto.

To buy or otherwise acquire or undertake and carry on all or any of the business, good-will, property or liability of any person or persons, corporation or corporations carrying on any business which the said Company is authorized to carry on and generally to do all things necessary therefor and incident thereto.

To act as agent for any person or persons, corporation or corporations, and generally to do all things necessary therefor and incident thereto.

To use, develop, manufacture or produce steam, water or electricity, or any other power, force or energy capable of being developed into mechanical power, as a motive power or otherwise.

To buy, or otherwise acquire, possess, build, erect, hold, and keep, improve, manage, lease, mortgage, hypothecate, alienate, sell and convey all real and personal estate and property requisite for carrying on of the undertakings of the said Company, including mills, starch factories, fixtures, work-shops, warehouses, storehouses, dwellings, barns and all other buildings, structures and erections by the said Company or its Directors, when deemed necessary, expedient or advisable to be bought or built, and generally to do all things necessary therefor and incident thereto; by the name of "THE J. W. DUMAS COMPANY, (Limited);" with a total Capital Stock of Nine thousand dollars, divided into nine hundred shares of Ten dollars each.
