To carry, convey or transport passengers, mails and freight of all kinds, and to do the work of common carriers by steamers, vessels and other conveyances, and in connection therewith to provide, furnish and sell food, refreshments and entertainment on water and land.

To mortgage, hypothecate, sell or in any way dispose of all or any of the Company's property, interests or possessions as may be deemed desirable by the Company.
