

## NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the twenty-first day of April, A. D. 1902, incorporating Charles W. Brannen, of the City of Saint John in the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick, Master Mariner; George F. Brannen, of the same place, Accountant; James Barber, of the same place, Shipping Surveyor; Addie McLean, of Chipman, in the County of Queen's in said Province, Widow; Beatrice E. Waring, of the said City of Saint John, Spinster; John P. Johnson, of Woodstock in the County of Carleton and Province aforesaid, Engineer; R. Harvey Weston, of the said City of Saint John, Mate; and Charlotte A. Waring, of the said City of Saint John, Married Woman; for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase or otherwise acquire the Steamer "May Queen," registered at the Port of Saint John, with all requisite equipment for the same, and to equip, own, control, sail, charter, let, hire and manage the said Steamer, and such other steamer and steamers, if any, as may be hereafter purchased, built, owned, leased, or otherwise acquired or controlled by said Company for the conveyance of passengers, mails and freight upon the waters of the River Saint John and its tributaries, and other waters within the Province of New Brunswick.

Also to build, purchase, charter or otherwise acquire steamers, vessels and other conveyances using steam or other motive power, and to equip, own, hold, control, manage, charter, let and hire the same for the conveyance of passengers, mails and freight, and for other purposes.

To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire lands, tenements and hereditaments, and construct, build, purchase, take and lease or otherwise acquire wharves, piers, docks, buildings or other property or works, and such concessions, licenses and rights in respect of any of the same capable of being advantageously used in connection with the business of the Company.

To carry, convey or transport passengers, mails and freight of all kinds and to do the work of common carriers by steamers, vessels and other conveyances and in connection therewith to provide, furnish and sell food, refreshments and entertainment on water and land.

To mortgage, hypothecate, sell or in any way dispose of all or any of the Company's property, interests or possessions as may be deemed desirable by the Company.

To hold, purchase or otherwise acquire, sell, assign, transfers mortgage, pledge or otherwise dispose of shares of the Capital Stock and bonds, debentures or other evidences of indebtedness, created by any other corporation or corporations, and while the holder thereof to exercise all the rights and privileges of ownership including the right to vote thereon.

To do any or all of the things above set forth as objects, purposes, powers or otherwise to the same extent and as fully as natural persons might or could do as principals, agents, contractors, trustees or otherwise.

To do all and everything incident, usual, necessary, suitable, convenient or proper for the accomplishment of any of the purposes or the attainment of any one or more of the objects herein enumerated or incidental to the powers herein named, or which shall at any time appear conducive or expedient for the protection or benefit of the corporation, either as holder of or interested in any property or otherwise; with all the powers now or hereafter conferred by the laws of the said Province upon corporations under the said Act and the Acts in amendment thereof; by the name of "MAY QUEEN STEAMSHIP COMPANY, (Limited);" with a total Capital Stock of Twenty thousand dollars divided into two hundred shares of One hundred dollars each.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, for a Grant of Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and Acts in amendment thereof and in addition thereto, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned and set forth.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is the "C. S. GOGGIN COMPANY, (Limited)."

2. The object for which incorporation of the Company is sought is:—

(a) To purchase, acquire and take over the stock, stock-in-trade, business, property, assets, rights and credits of C. S. Goggin & Co. carrying on the business of selling on the instalment plan of household goods, jewelry and fancy goods at the City of Saint John.

(b) To carry on the business of selling at retail and on the instalment plan of general house furnishings, stoves, watches, jewelry, silverware and any other goods that may be deemed necessary for such business.

(c) To purchase, lease, acquire and hold real and personal estate of all kinds, including bonds and stocks of any incorporated Company, and to own, acquire, have and hold security upon any real or personal property or effects whatsoever.

(d) To purchase and acquire the stock-in-trade, real and personal property, franchises, patents, patent rights, licenses and effects and estates of any person or persons or incorporated Company now or hereafter carrying on any similar business or to take security thereon and to continue the same when so acquired, and to sell and dispose of same when so acquired, and any and every part thereof.

(e) To purchase, acquire, lease, have and hold real and personal

property, property of all kinds, and to sell and dispose of and convey such property real and personal, or any part thereof.

(f) To sell and convey, alienate, lease, mortgage, pledge or otherwise dispose of or deal with all and every part of the property, both real and personal, of the said Company, upon any terms whatsoever, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, together with all such powers, rights, privileges and franchises as are necessary or expedient for the carrying on of the said business of the said Company in all its branches with such other powers as are incident thereto.

(g) To carry on any other business which may seem to the Company capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with the above or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of the goods, property or rights.

3. The office or principal place of business is to be at the City of Saint John, in the County of the City and County of Saint John.

4. The nominal value of the Company is Twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) to be divided into four hundred shares of Fifty dollars each.
