NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named, to the Lieutenant-Governor in Council for a Grant of Letters Patent, under the Great Seal, under the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts, constituting the applicants and others who may become shareholders in the Company to be thereby created, a body corporate and politic, for the purposes and objects hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:
