LIQUOR LICENSE ACT, 1896.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN. That the Board of License Commissioners for the License District of Restigouche County, under "The Liquor License Act, 1896," will meet in the Court House in the Town of Dalhousie, on THURSDAY the 24th day of APRIL, A. D. 1902, at ten o'clock, a. m., for the purpose of considering applications to sell liquor under the provisions of the said Act, as well as all matters relating thereto, for the ensuing license year, commencing the first day of May next.

The total number of licenses in this district at present is six, all retail; and three of the licensees, namely: Thomas Murphy, Michael P. Doyle, and Felix Ultican, have petitioned for a renewal of their licenses for their respective hotel premises for another year. The other three licensees, namely: George E. Mercier, John M. McLeod, and John C. Barclay, have retired from the business. The last named has leased his hotel premises at Jacquet River to John Barbour, who now occupies the premises and who has petitioned for a renewal of the license for the same premises for another year in the place of the said John C. Barclay. And the other two hotel keepers have sold their respective hotel premises, in the Town of Dalhousie, to the undermentioned purchasers, namely: Leon Samson and Henry Whipper respectively. These two new proprietors have petitioned for a renewal of the same class of license for their respective premises for another year, in place of the former proprietors of the same.

The number of applications for the sale of liquor during the ensuing license year is seven, all retail, which shows that there is one new applicant. The new applicant is Finton Hines, of Belledune, who has petitioned for a license to sell liquor by retail, in the town of Dalhousie, in the premises known as Mrs. Beckingham's Boarding House, stating that he has rented the same for the purpose of selling liquor on the premises during the ensuing license year, if he can obtain such license for the said premises.
