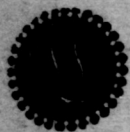

NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR LETTERS PATENT.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made by
the applicants hereinafter named, to His Honour the Lieutenant-
Governor in Council for a Grant by Letters Patent, under the
Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the
provisions of the Act of the General Assembly 56 Victoria, Chap-
ter 7, intituled "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies'
Act, 1893," and Acts in amendment thereof, to incorporate the ap-
plicants and such other persons as may hereafter become share-
holders in the said proposed Company, a body corporate and politic
under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

1. The proposed name of the Company is the "FREDERICTON
SKATING RINK COMPANY, (Limited)."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:

(a) To construct, erect, acquire and maintain and conduct a
building or buildings in the City of Fredericton, for use as a
skating rink and other purposes of the Company, and to provide

such time and on such terms and at such rate per centum as shall
be approved by the Directors of the said Company.

4. The amount of the Capital Stock to be Ten thousand dollars.
