NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named, to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, for a Grant of Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of the Act of the General Assembly, 56th Victoria, Chapter 7, intituled "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and the Acts in amendment thereof, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the said proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

(c) To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire lands, tenements and hereditaments, and construct, build, purchase, lease, take on, hire or otherwise acquire wharves, piers, docks, buildings or other property or works or equipment in the City of Saint John in said Province, and elsewhere, and such concessions, licenses and rights in respect of any of the same capable of being advantageously used in connection with the business of the Company.

(d) To carry, convey or transport passengers, mails and freight of all kinds for hire, and to do the work of common carriers by steamers, vessels and other conveyances, and in connection therewith to provide, furnish and sell food, refreshments and entertainment on water and land.

(e) To mortgage, hypothecate, sell, or in any way dispose of all or any of the Company's properts, rights interests.
